Implementation of media literacy in Ukraine


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Translation and publication of journalism and media literacy manuals

Since 2010, AUP has been the first nongovernmental organization in Ukraine to initiate the development and implementation of media education in the country.

Over the years, AUP has become a widely recognized leader in the post-Soviet region in the field of journalist and media educator retraining. This is evidenced by the numerous training sessions conducted by AUP experts with journalists and specialists in Azerbaijan, Belarus, Armenia, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Moldova, Uzbekistan, and Tajikistan.

# MAIN AREAS OF WORK




#### Support for Journalists and Media Professionals

- Supporting the publication and distribution of frontline newspapers.
- Organizing training sessions for media professionals on professional standards, factchecking, and media ethics.
- Holding discussions with international experts on current challenges in journalism.
- Providing psychological support for media representatives working in difficult conditions.



#### Development of Media Literacy

- Educational activities for students and schoolchildren on media content analysis.
- Collaboration with educators to integrate media literacy into the educational process.
- Promoting information culture through social media and events.



#### Support for Democratic Institutions

- Collaboration with educational institutions on the implementation of media literacy.
- Consulting for civil society organizations on information security.
- Analytical work and research on the information space.
- Honoring the memory of media professionals who lost their lives in the Russia– Ukraine war.

# **Key Achievements of 2024**

- 249,470 participants engaged in educational and training activities.
- journalists.
- 485,000 views on Facebook and YouTube.
- 4 online discussions with international experts from Moldova, Italy, Japan, and the USA.
- 11 manuals published for journalists and educators.
- AUP's educational program for 10th-11th grades successfully passed expert evaluation and received the official approval of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine for use in the educational process.
- A five-year memorandum of cooperation signed with the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine to develop media literacy.
- 2,906 educators and students successfully completed online courses on the AUP+ platform.
- At AUP's request, the sociological company SocioInform conducted research on the state of media literacy implementation in Ukrainian schools.
- 10 mini-projects implemented to improve media literacy integration in rural communities.
- 4 forums held for educational administrators and teachers in different regions.
